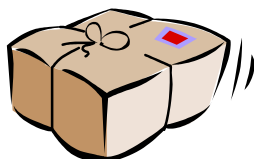

On UPS and Fed-Ex packages, the terminology "Post Office Box" MUST be replaced with Landrum Box because when these private carriers see "Post Office Box," they assume we are a federal post office and they cannot deliver items to a federal post office. ## Spotlight on . . . Dr. Martha Abell



Dr. Martha Abell is a full professor in the Department of Mathematical Sciences and director of the University Honors Program and the Bell Honors Program. She teaches several mathematics courses, including Honors Calculus I and II. Dr. Abell has been at Georgia Southern since fall 1989. What Dr. Abell enjoys most about Georgia Southern is the fact that it has a family atmosphere, which “makes it a dynamic place in which to work.” She says that she was inspired to teach math because she always “enjoyed helping my classmates and friends with their math homework; I received positive feedback from the students I tutored and found it fun.”

In her spare time, she enjoys playing tennis. Dr. Abell plays in leagues in both Statesboro and Savannah. Her team in Savannah won the state tournament and the Southeastern U.S. tournament this past fall. She also plays the handbell in the choir at Statesboro First United Methodist Church. Her advice to students is to attend class each day and take notes. Subjects are much easier when you keep up on a daily basis. Dr. Abell also encourages students to complete assignments even when the professor will not be grading it. Her final piece of advice to students is to “get involved in campus activities because the college experience goes far beyond the classroom.”

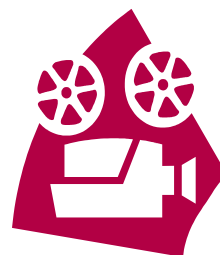


## Women & Weights
