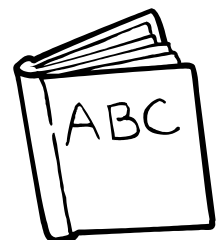

Spotlight on . . . Dr. Nancy Shumaker

Dr. Nancy Shumaker is the Director of the Center for International Studies. She teaches GSU 1210 every fall semester, but before she became director of International Studies, she taught Spanish and Latin American civilization and literature classes. Dr. Shumaker has been at Georgia Southern since 1982, and in 1984, after becoming a full-time member of the Foreign Language Department, she developed the Summer Study Abroad Program in Costa Rica and also served as Co-Coordinator of the Foreign Language and Culture Center. Dr. Shumaker's passion for Spanish, Latin America, and all things international began in 1960 when her family went to Santiago, Chile, for a year and a half with the United Nations. She spent a semester abroad in Peru during her junior year in college and has been traveling ever since. What she enjoys most about her job "is the opportunity to work closely with students and faculty, helping them to become involved in international programs both here and abroad." She also enjoys being able to travel to other countries to set up programs with international universities. Dr. Shumaker received her B.A. in Spanish Literature from Swarthmore College, an M.A. in Linguistics from the University of Georgia, and a Ph.D. in Linguistics from the University of Georgia.

In her spare time, she enjoys traveling (she tries to go somewhere different every year). She also enjoys creative writing, so every summer she takes a creative writing class at the Chautauqua Institute in New York. Dr. Shumaker reads a great deal in both English and Spanish. Her advice to students is three-fold: 1) "Become involved in some activities—clubs, sports, student government—because that way you'll meet a lot of people and feel more a part of the Georgia Southern community as a whole." 2) "Take some classes that interest you and not just because they're part of your major." 3) "Study abroad! You will find it a life-changing experience and one that will add to your self-confidence and your appreciation of the world around you."
