Spotlight on . . . Dr. Olivia Edenfield

Dr. Olivia Edenfield is the Interim Associate Dean in the College of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences (CLASS). She is also an Associate Professor who teaches composition courses and the American Studies Senior Seminar. As Associate Dean, she works with SOAR in advising new students on what classes to take. She also assists with the Dean’s Advisory Council, a group of student leaders within CLASS. She is actively involved in recruitment and visitation for prospective students.

Dr. Edenfield was an undergraduate student at Georgia Southern, received her master’s degree in English at Iowa State and her Ph.D. from the University of Georgia in American Literature. She began teaching at Southern in 1986 in the English Department. Dr. Edenfield spends her spare time running and being with her husband and two kids. She enjoys the students at Georgia Southern, who are “creative, friendly, responsible and intelligent.” Her advice to students is go to class everyday! Also, she suggests for students to get to know their professors in the beginning by going to office hours and to form those connections early on. She says the CLASS faculty are very receptive to students, so make use of them as a resource. Another piece of advice: “Don’t drink and drive and don’t ride with people who do!”
