Student Handbook Correction

Fireworks and Explosives (page 45)

"Firearms, fireworks, weapons, ammunition, explosives, paint guns, flammable liquids and cylinders containing compress gas are prohibited on Georgia Southern University's property or in residence halls. This includes Martial Arts equipment. Students found in violation of this policy could be removed from student housing or dismissed from Georgia Southern University."

Bacterial Meningitis

Bacterial Meningitis is a bacterial infection of the brain and spinal cord. Some symptoms include fever, severe headaches, stiff neck, rash, nausea, vomiting, sensitivity to light, and lethargy (feeling tired and worn out). These symptoms are sometimes mistaken for the flu. The infection progresses rapidly in as little as 12 to 48 hours. Meningitis is transmitted through the air via droplets of respiratory secretions and by having direct contact with any secretions/excretions from the body of an infected person. A vaccine is available and may provide protection

Hepatitis B

Hepatitis B is a serious virus that causes inflammation of the liver. The symptoms range from loss of appetite to nausea and vomiting, abdominal pain, fever, headache, brownish urine, light gray stools, and jaundice (yellowing of the skin and eyes). You can be infected with hepatitis directly, through infected blood or body fluids, indirectly, by coming into contact with surfaces or objects contaminated with the virus. Some common ways of contracting hepatitis B are sexual contact, sharing toothbrushes or earrings with an infected person, touching eyes or mouth, needles, cuts and scrapes during contact sports, and potentially by piercing or tattooing. The vaccine for hepatitis B is a series of three shots given over six months.

Health Services has contracted with VACCESSHealth, a private company, to provide a meningitis and hepatitis B vaccine program. This vaccine program is offered for one day only. For more information about this program, please contact VACCESSHealth at www.vaccess.com or call toll free at 1-877-482-2237.

Health Services also offers these services on a drop-in basis during business hours. The meningitis vaccine is \$75 and the hepatitis vaccine is \$45 per dose.
