Persons violating these guidelines will be dealt with via the judicial process.



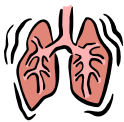


## Spotlight on . . . Dr. Eleanor Agnew

Dr. Eleanor Agnew is an Associate Professor in the Department of Writing and Linguistics. She teaches English 1101 and 1102, Writing in the Workplace, Teaching Writing, Advanced Composition, Technical Writing, and she also works as a consultant at the University Writing Center. Dr. Agnew has been at Georgia Southern since fall, 1989. She received her B.A. from the University of Vermont, her M.A. from the University of Maine at Orono, and her Ph.D. from Louisiana State University. When asked why she chose a career in teaching and writing, she responds, "I've always been a writer interested in writing. I don't feel alive unless I'm writing, learning something, or, preferably, both!"

What she loves most about Georgia Southern is the fact that she is in one of the few independent writing programs in the country. The Department of Writing and Linguistics is a free-standing department which will soon have a writing major beginning in January. For the past year, she has been writing a book called *Back from the Land*, which has involved interviewing several people who were part of the 1970's back-to-the-land movement. Dr. Agnew, too, was a back-to-the-land person who, for five years, lived in a log cabin in Maine and hauled water and grew her own food. Her book is expected to be published this spring. In her spare time, she also enjoys traveling, watching movies, and hanging out with her family.

Her advice to students is to realize how lucky that you are. She encourages students to see all the learning opportunities around you and to immerse yourselves in them. She also warns that it is not all about the grades: "All the best grades in the world won't get you anywhere if you don't have a strong body of knowledge to go with it."
