



Common Questions about Room Selection for Fall 2005

- *What is Room Selection?* Room selection is the process by which current residence hall students choose a room for the 2005- 2006 academic year.
- *Who is eligible to participate in Room Selection?* All students who currently reside in University Housing are eligible. There will NOT be a lottery as was the case in previous years. **All students who desire a room will be guaranteed a room somewhere in campus housing provided they meet the posted deadlines.**
- *How does the process actually work?* Within the next several days you will be receiving a brochure in your campus P.O. box that explains how you apply (including the link to the website where you apply as well as your user name and password), how to pick your roommates, what buildings are open for you to live in next year and other important information. Please note that some of the dates for the Information Sessions/Open Houses listed in the brochure have been changed and the correct information is noted below.
- *What types of housing other than traditional "dorms" are available on campus? Why should I consider living on campus when I can get an apartment off campus?* Upper-class housing options include suites and apartments. For the 2005- 2006 school year only upper-class students will be eligible to live in Southern Pines (suite style with private bedrooms), Southern Courtyard (11 ½ month apartments with private bedrooms), Watson Commons (suite style with shared bedrooms), Sanford (apartments with shared bedrooms), and Kennedy (suite and apartment style shared bedrooms). Kennedy Hall and Southern Pines will have some first-year students who are athletes.
- *This is all new to me. How can I find out more?* To learn more about Room Selection, how to apply, how to pick where you want to live, or to have any questions answered, you may attend any of the following Room Selection Information Sessions/Open Houses. Please note these dates are different than the ones listed in the Room Selection Brochure mailed to your campus P.O. box.

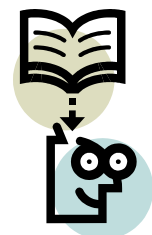
