



Veazey Hall: Residence Hall No More!

Completed in 1959, Veazey Hall was officially named after Ms. Mamie Veazey (1886-1955) on February 15, 1961. Ms. Veazey served as Dean of Women from 1930 until her retirement in 1952. Before coming to what is now Georgia Southern, she taught in the public schools of her native Alabama and in Lafayette and Carrollton, Georgia. Remembered for her high moral standards and untiring service to the University, Dean Veazey's accomplishments were instrumental in directing Southern's growth and changes during the 1930s and 1940s. After students check out in May, Veazey will no longer serve as a residence hall. It will be converted for use as a classroom building for Communication Arts. Come commemorate the history of Veazey Hall at the Closing Cookout Celebration on Wednesday, April 13 at 5 p.m.

Are We Tanning to Death?

Did you know that skin cancer is the most common type of cancer? Over 700,000 people develop skin cancer each year. Most people can be cured when diagnosed early. The most common cause of skin cancer is overexposure to ultraviolet rays emitted from the sun and sunlamps.



Prevention

- Stay out of the sun: From 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. is when the sun's rays are the strongest.
- Use sunscreen. A Sun Protective Factor (SPF) of at least 15 is recommended. It should be applied at least 15-30 minutes prior to getting in the sun.
- You can still get burned even when it's cloudy.
- Swimming pools: Even if you are in the pool, the sun's rays can reach through three feet of water. Apply waterproof sunscreen.
- Tanning beds are just as harmful to your body as the sun. Tan in moderation. Keep your skin hydrated by drinking water and by staying away from dehydrating products such as caffeine, alcohol, and sugar.
