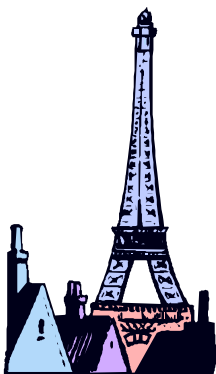


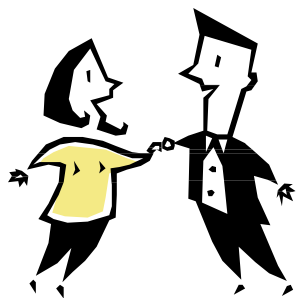


An Event of GLOBAL Proportions!
