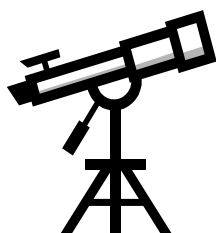

Dr. Hudak has been at Georgia Southern for fifteen years, and she says that now that she is an administrator, she enjoys “being in a position to make a positive change for students and faculty.” She is a native of Chillicothe, Ohio, and received her Ph.D. in art education from The Ohio State University. 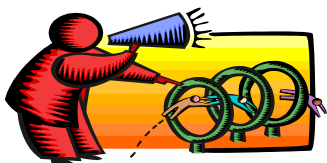

“Jurassic Park” Paleontologist to Speak at Georgia Southern

Renowned paleontologist Jack Horner will deliver a lecture at Georgia Southern University on Tuesday at 7:30 p.m. in the Assembly Hall of the Nessmith-Lane Continuing Education Building. Considered to be the model for the main character in the Jurassic Park movies, Horner is curator of paleontology at the Museum of the Rockies in Bozeman, Montana. He is credited with discovering the first dinosaur eggs in the Western Hemisphere. Horner’s program is in conjunction with a special museum exhibit, “Hatching the Past: The Great Dinosaur Egg Hunt,” currently on display in the Nessmith-Lane Building.
