Cinema Arts: *Baraka*

The Cinema Arts Program presents *Baraka* (1993) on Monday, October 25 at 7:15 p.m. in the Union Theatre. Admission is \$2. Named after a Sufi word that translates roughly as “breath of life” or “blessing,” *Baraka* is a cinematic “guided mediation” shot in 24 countries on six continents over a 14-month period that unites religious ritual, the phenomena of nature, and man’s own destructive powers into a web of moving images.



Spotlight On . . . Ms. Lydia Karakolidis



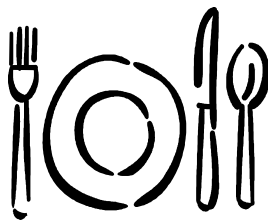
