### Graduate School Admission Tips

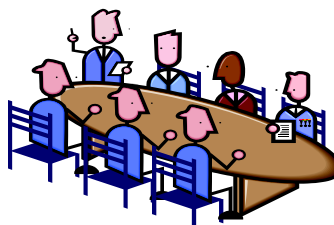


- Consider applying to several graduate schools.
- Request application and financial aid forms as soon as possible.
- Visit campuses to see the buildings, classrooms, library, etc.
- Start preparing your application package early.
- Be aware of academic requirements.
- Grades: The tougher your courses and the better your grades, the more options you will have.
- Submit applications, supporting documents, and fees well before the deadline.
- Fill in all forms completely.
- Organize your financial records.
- Keep a record of all applications for each college and copies of all relevant forms.
