



Bicycle Storage

Storing bicycles in any on-campus residential facility or parking bicycles in any location that is not an approved bike rack location is a violation of the regulations as outlined in the Student Conduct Code. This includes parking/storing of your bikes in public areas such as hallways, stairwells, chained to light-posts or signs, etc.

Bikes stored inappropriately will be removed from these locations and stored in University Housing for a limited time. Bikes can be picked up at University Housing in Watson Hall. Upon pick-up, students will be advised of their policy violation and will be charged a \$25 collection fee that is applied to the student's University account. Bikes not picked up will be donated to a local charity. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to talk to your building director.

Spotlight On . . . Theresa Welford

Theresa (aka Terry) Welford, who grew up in a working-class community just outside Savannah, Georgia, has been teaching at Georgia Southern since 1987. Theresa and her husband, Mark Welford, live outside Statesboro on 25 acres of forested property, which they share with the local wildlife. She has also been a vegetarian for nearly twenty-two years (though she indulges in daily caffeine and chocolate fixes).

Theresa has completed her dissertation, which she successfully defended in September, and she is now awaiting final confirmation from the University of Essex (in Colchester, England) that she has indeed been granted a PhD. Theresa has also edited a collection of poetry in a recently created form called the "paradelle," which began life as a spoof created by former Poet Laureate Billy Collins. In addition, Theresa has published her own poetry and several articles, including a chapter in *Those Winter Sundays: Female Academics and Their Working-Class Parents*. Although Theresa has landed far closer to home than she ever thought she would, she has wandered fairly extensively, having traveled to most of the states in the U.S., along with Canada, the Czech Republic, Ecuador, England, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Holland, Hungary, Luxembourg, Norway, Poland, Romania, Slovakia, and Sweden. Given her interest in travel, it is not surprising that Theresa enjoys teaching FIG sections of English 1101 and 1102 with a focus on Travel and Culture.

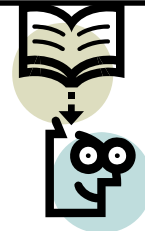

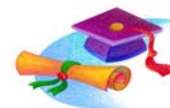
