



Eagle Expo/Education Career Fair

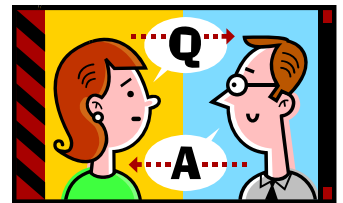

Spotlight On . . . Dr. Tiffanie Townsend



Professor Tiffanie Townsend is a new assistant professor of art history at Georgia Southern and teaches a range of art history courses as well as Humanities I with Professors Gregory Harwood and Doug Thomson. She received her B.A. and M.A. in art history, and most recently completed her Ph.D. at the University of Georgia where she also taught as a graduate assistant and an adjunct professor. In the year before coming to GSU in the fall of 2005, she taught art history and English Composition at Zayed University, a women's university in Abu Dhabi, United Arab Emirates, where her husband is a professor of literature.

Dr. Townsend's specialty is the art of the Italian Renaissance; lately her research has been on grotesque and monstrous imagery, on which she will be presenting a public lecture on Wednesday, April 12, from 5-7 p.m. in the auditorium of GSU's Arts Building.

Having lived in the Middle East and Italy and traveled extensively through Europe, Dr. Townsend is passionate about going to new places, seeing their architecture and works of art, trying their foods, and meeting their people. When not focusing on art history, she enjoys relaxing with her family at her parents' lake house in central Georgia, hanging out with her friends, seeking out the best barbeque in the south, reading, and watching movies.

Pat Steadman Sculpture Exhibition

An opening reception honoring Steadman on his retirement will be held on Friday, Feb. 17, from 7 p.m. to 9 p.m. in the gallery. He will also present the talk "Steadman on Sculpture" at 7:30 p.m.
