Spotlight On . . . Dr. Mark Richardson



Dr. Richardson, who has been teaching English in some form or another for thirty years, first hit on his career choice in the fourth grade (diagramming sentences). Still, that didn't stop him from trying to major in philosophy and religion, then anthropology, then biology, and then art history at Colgate University in upstate New York, where he did his undergraduate work, before returning to English literature once and for all. After graduating, he attended Emory University in Atlanta, Georgia, where he received his MA and PhD in English, finishing in 1980. His dissertation was concerned with medieval and Renaissance soap operas. (Really!)

Since then, he has mainly taught college-level writing classes, often harnessing his interest in various subjects by linking his writing classes to courses in other disciplines (biology, philosophy, history, sociology). He remains convinced that the most important and mysterious part of the writing process involves the transformation of a paper from an act of learning to an act of teaching—a transformation that is still not fully understood. Deep down, he thinks that this process really only happens within disciplines and cannot be easily accomplished via the external agency of a writing class.
