## Spotlight on . . . Dr. Suellynn Duffey

Suellynn Duffey teaches English 1101, 1102, and a variety of other courses in writing and linguistics. She has written essays for professional journals like Writing on the Edge and Rhetoric Review, journals that students are not likely to subscribe to or read but that have cool—or at least intriguing names! The latest article she is working on combines stories of a family reunion when she was a child, legacies left to her through her great-grandmother and other female relatives, and history of the Underground Railroad in Ohio. This article’s topics and style (using the techniques of what’s called “creative non-fiction”) might make it more appealing to students than some of her other work.

In her classes, she occasionally makes reference to her son, who is a bike mechanic in Ohio and who had rotator cuff surgery last summer. Lately, some of her students advised her on how to handle a problem she was having with the woman he wants to propose marriage to! Dr. Duffey’s department honored her with its teaching award last year, and students in her class seem to pay attention during class discussion, waiting with interest as one said recently, to “see what she’ll say next!”
