



Advisement and Registration

It may be hard to believe it, but advisement and registration for spring 2006 is upon us! Registration on WINGS starts October 24 at 3 a.m. for seniors and post-baccalaureate students. WINGS will be open to juniors, sophomores, and first-year students after this date based on the number of hours earned and sometimes a random number generator. You may find out when you may begin registering by accessing WINGS.

Remember: You **MUST** be advised before you can register. Where you are advised is based on your major.

Requirements

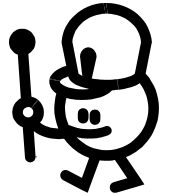
All leadership sessions are open to all students. If you attend a total of 9 hours of workshop in two semesters you will earn a Leadership Certificate.
