Internet Surfing Tips and Tricks

Surfing the internet is a fun pastime that many of us enjoy, but some of us become upset when our Web browser isn't doing exactly what we think it should be doing. A lot of the time, we get upset because it is going way too slow or because we can't find the page that we are looking for.

To help enhance your experience with the World Wide Web, here are a few tips:

1. When you click on a link and the page doesn't automatically pop up, do not try clicking the link again. Somewhere in your browser you should see a status bar showing that the browser is working to display the content of the new page. If perhaps you don't see any indication that the browser is working on processing your request, try clicking it once more.
2. It is really easy to waste time while surfing the Web. If you don't want to spend all day on the Internet, have a plan in mind before you begin your surfing escapades. Stay focused on the subject you're searching, and try not to get way off track.
3. Searching the Web for material on a particular subject can be very tricky. Here's a tip: Before starting your search, spend a little time writing down some words, or *keywords*, that describe what you're searching for. If you have any specific Web pages in mind, write those URL addresses down so that you don't forget them.
4. Do you have any favorite search engines? If not, do a little looking around for one or two that tend to deliver the best results. One really popular one is Google (<http://www.google.com/>).
