



Advisement and Registration

It may be hard to believe, but advisement and registration for spring 2007 is upon us! Registration on WINGS starts October 23 at 3am for seniors and post-baccalaureate students. WINGS will be open to juniors, sophomores, and first-year students after this date based on the number of hours earned and sometimes a random number generator. You can find out when you may begin registering by accessing WINGS.

Remember: You **MUST** be advised before you can register. Where you are advised is based on your major.

Henderson Library Addition is Now Open!

For more than three decades, the Zach S. Henderson Library has been the hub of academic life at Georgia Southern University. Since the summer of 2004, the library has also been the focus of an extensive expansion and renovation that will help it keep up with the needs of the University's growing student body. The first phase of the \$22.7 million project – an 89,000-square foot addition to the east side of the original building – has been completed and was opened to the public on October 1.



The entrance to the new addition is highlighted by a striking three-story glass atrium and a virtual waterfall. Once inside the addition, library patrons will find wireless access and laptops that can be borrowed for use within the building; two classrooms that contain a total of 60 computers; and a multipurpose room with seating for up to 50 people. The addition is also the home of a unique automated retrieval collection (ARC) system that is capable of storing 800,000 items in 5,848 separate bins that are stacked 45 feet in the air.

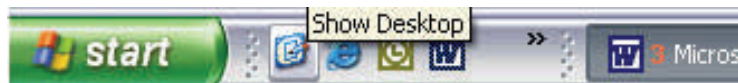
The second and final phase of the Henderson Library expansion and renovation project is expected to begin November 2006. Storage space at this time will be at a premium, but as W. Bede Mitchell, dean of Henderson Library, says "Our collections...are unique...so we decided to keep as many materials as possible in open stacks as opposed to remote storage."

Completion of the entire project is scheduled for the fall of 2008.

Windows Tricks & Tips

Get Back to the Desktop Quickly

No matter how many windows you have open, you can always minimize all of them at once by clicking the Show Desktop button in the Quick Launch part of the taskbar in Windows XP. If you change your mind and don't want to use the desktop, you can click the Show Desktop button again to restore all of your open windows.



Note: If you don't see the Show Desktop button, right-click an empty part of the taskbar, point to Toolbars, and make sure Quick Launch is checked. If it's not, then click it.
