



Get Ready to Apply for Financial Aid for Fall 2007 & Spring 2008

- The first step in applying for need-based financial aid is completing the Free Application for Financial Student Aid (FAFSA) online at <http://www.fafsa.ed.gov> beginning January 2, 2007. By completing the FAFSA, you are applying for federal grants, loans, work study, and the HOPE Scholarship.
- The priority date for completing the FAFSA is April 20, 2007. It is important to apply by the priority date of April 20, 2007, because funds are limited for campus need-based financial aid which includes the Federal Perkins Loan, the Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant, and the Federal Work Study Program.
- When filling out the FAFSA, be sure to list Georgia Southern University's Title IV school code (001572) and your name exactly as it appears on your social security card.
- If you are applying for the HOPE Scholarship ONLY, you do not need to complete the FAFSA application; however, you WILL NOT be reviewed for student loans or need-based financial aid if you do not complete the FAFSA. Need-based aid includes grants, loans, and the work study program. If you are applying for HOPE only, you should complete a GSFAPP application online at www.GAcollege411.org.
- Be aware that after you apply, additional information may be requested in order for the financial aid department to determine your financial aid eligibility. If additional information is requested, it must be submitted NO LATER THAN June 15, 2007 to ensure that your financial aid is not delayed for fall term.

Windows XP Tips & Tricks from Microsoft

Move Backward and Forward Between Web Pages More Quickly

In Internet Explorer 6 in Windows XP, you can click the Back and Forward buttons to move back and forth between pages you've recently viewed, one page at a time. If you want to go back several pages and forward again more quickly, click the small black arrow next to the Back and Forward buttons to see a list of pages you've recently viewed—and then just click the page you want. You can also display this list by right-clicking the Back or Forward buttons.
