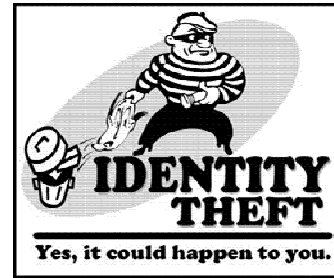

Career Corner Graduate School Admission Tips

1. Consider Applying to several graduate schools.
2. Request application and financial aid forms as soon as possible.
3. Visit campuses to see the buildings, classrooms, library, etc.
4. Start preparing your application package early.
5. Be aware of academic requirements.
6. Grades: The tougher your courses and the better your grades, the more options you have.
7. Submit applications, supporting documents, and fees well before the deadline.
8. Fill in all forms completely.
9. Organize your financial records
10. Keep a record of all applications for each college and copies of all relevant forms.
