4-week Congressional Internship

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible to apply, current undergraduate students must:

Have completed 36 hours in residence at Georgia Southern University by January 1, 2008.

Have a GPA of at least 3.0.

Be available to interview in person in March, before spring break.

Submit a complete application by Friday, February 29, 2008 to the Office of the Vice President for Student Affairs and Enrollment Management (Marvin Pittman Administration Building, Suite 2020).
