INTERNET SAFETY TIPS



- 1. Stranger Danger** – Do not talk to strangers or add them to your friends list.
- 2. Who’s Who?** – People may not be who they say they are, so do not assume they look or act as they do online.
- 3. Speak Out** – If someone seems to be dangerous in any way, tell an authority figure.
- 4. Homeland Security** – Do not download anything that could possibly harm your computer or invade your privacy.
- 5. Never** – meet someone in person you “met” online; it’s extremely dangerous.
- 6. Keep It 2 Yourself** – Be sure to keep personal information private, such as your address, phone number, or school. Posting a picture of your Photo ID, a picture of your car, or your building or room number should also be avoided.
- 7. Self-Conscience** – If something seems wrong to you, it probably is; follow your instincts.
- 8. Chats** – Do not chat with people you do not know as it could lead you into risky situations.
- 9. R-E-S-P-E-C-T** – Respect yourself and others. Do not say or do things online that you would not say in person, especially things that could embarrass you, your friends, or your family.
- 10. Enjoy** – Most importantly, have fun and be safe by chatting with people you know and avoiding bad situations. People can be much crueler online because they do not have to say things to you face to face. Also, avoid people who bring you down, especially online.

“Absolute Delete”



Did you know that you can delete files without moving them to the Recycle Bin?



Instead of clicking on a file and hitting the “Delete” key, dragging the file to the Recycle Bin icon on your desktop, or right-clicking the file and choosing the “Delete” option from the drop-down menu, there’s a quicker way to delete a file that you’re absolutely sure you want erased from your computer. It is important that you make sure that you don’t need the file before you delete it in this way because it can’t be retrieved.

To delete a file immediately, click on the file and then hit the “Shift” and “Delete” keys together. A box will pop up asking if you are sure you want to delete the file. There is no turning back after choosing the “Yes” option, so if you’re sure you want to get rid of the file, click “Yes.”

The file is now completely erased from your computer and you won’t have to empty your Recycle Bin to make sure it’s deleted!

1. Go to: <http://www.focuscareer.com/register/georgiasouthern.cfm>
2. If you have not registered yet, click on the button that says create a new account
3. Complete all required fields. **Your keycode is gsualumni**
4. Create a username and password that you can remember
5. Print a copy of your registration information for your records
6. Click yes to login
7. Complete all phases of FOCUS on the left side of the menu
8. Go back to the main menu and click on “Printable Reports”
9. Print each section
10. Call Connie at 681-5197 to schedule an appointment with a Career Advisor to interpret your results.
