Did you know...

- People aged 12-24 constitute the group most vulnerable to sexual assault
- Seventy-five percent of date rapes involve alcohol or other drugs
- Eighty-four percent of all sexual assaults are committed by an acquaintance of the victim

Myths and Realities:

Myth #1: Rape does not happen very often

Reality: *Rape is the most frequently committed violent crime in the U.S.*

Myth #2: Most rapes are committed by a stranger in a dark place at night

Reality: *Nearly half of all assaults occur in the victim's home.*

Bottom line: Both men and women have the right to refuse a sexual encounter, or to end one once started, by simply saying no.

Are you looking for ways to gain relevant work experience while in school? Career Services can help! Employers want people with one year of experience; therefore, it is highly recommended that you complete at least two or more internships or co-op assignments prior to graduation. What's the difference? A co-op is an alternating work-school rotation in which you take classes one semester and work the next. An internship is usually just one semester. A co-op is always paid (\$9-\$19/hr), where an internship may be paid or unpaid. Co-ops are open to all majors, but are geared especially towards the engineering, science, and technology fields.

If you are interested in learning more about ways to gain experience, we encourage you to attend an information session with employer representatives from Gulfstream, The Southern Company, and the Army Corps of Engineers. 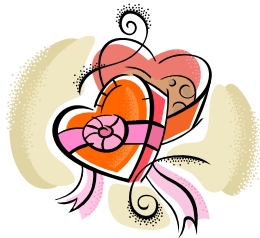
